#### For Educators

Sketchnoting is a powerful way for students to curate what they are learning into notes that they will actually remember.

In the process of thinking critically about how to sketchnote the material, they will prioritize important information, think about how best to illuminate it, and make connections between different key points.

In the end, they are far more likely to remember what they are trying to learn because of this process of thinking it through as they take notes, rather than just copying down everything they hear or read in order with no critical thinking components.

To help introduce students to sketchnoting before you begin, play them this video called "Sketcho Frenzy: The Basics of Visual Notetaking."
